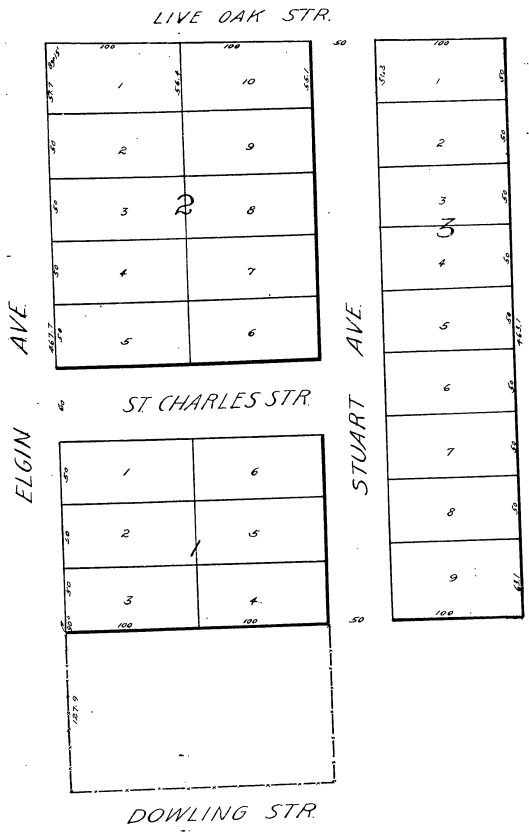

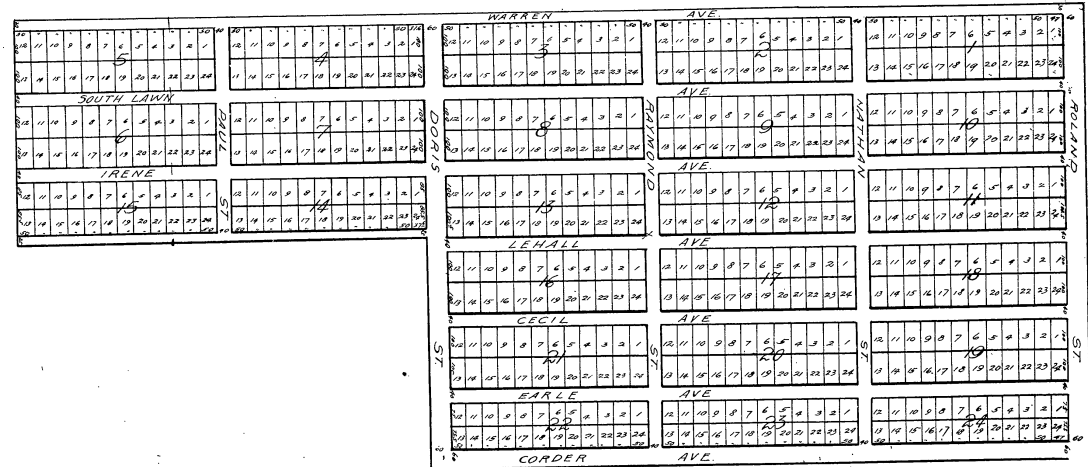

Scale 200' = 1" (Var. 51.15', Date January 25th, 1917)

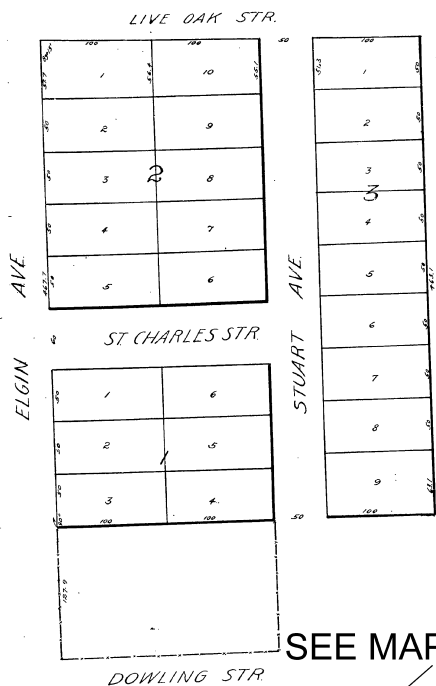

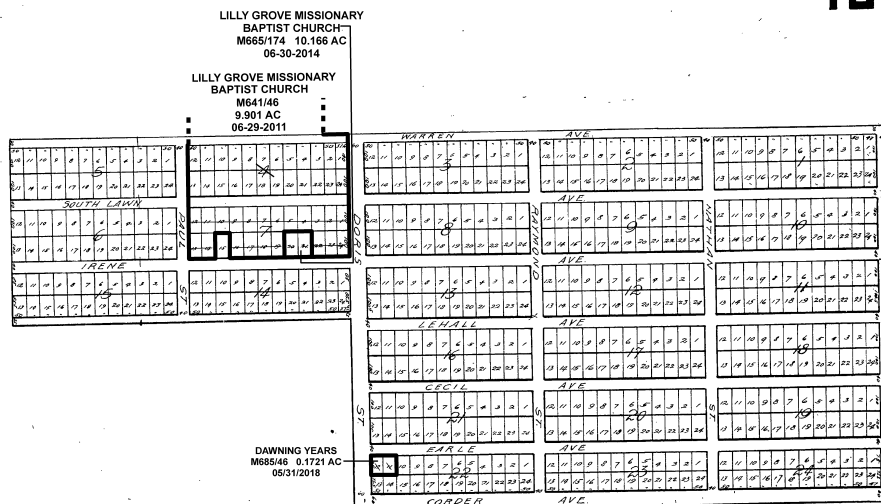
